Cymbelstern (drawstop and foot piston)
Eight general pistons (five duplicated by
foot pistons) and general cancel
Five foot pistons to the Pedal Organ
Five pistons to the Great Organ
Five pistons to the Swell Organ
Reversible pistons to all couplers,
duplicated by foot pistons
Balanced expression pedal
to the Swell Organ
Eight piston memories

The manual and pedal key actions are mechanical; the drawstop actions are electric.

The manual compass is 58 notes; the pedal 32 notes.
